**ToughBook CF-29 Gets Solaris & Linux Graphics Support**  
*Xi Graphics, Inc. releases Summit graphics drivers for new Panasonic notebook*

DENVER, February 9, 2004 ---- Xi Graphics, Inc. announced today that it has released Accelerated-X™ Summit v2.2 graphics drivers for the Panasonic CF-29 ToughBook running Linux or Solaris (on Intel) operating systems.

The ToughBook CF-29 tested at Xi Graphics employed Intel Extreme Graphics 2™ graphics hardware with up to 64 MB of shared memory, a 1.2 GHz Pentium® M processor, a 13.3 inch LCD screen with 1024x768 resolution, and the optional SuperClear touchscreen.

Both of the Xi Graphics’ Summit v2.2 Laptop (LX) graphics drivers for the ToughBook CF-29 support 2D and OpenGL 3D graphics rendering, the embedded touchscreen controller, and Xi Graphics’ DualView feature. The notebook's graphics performance figures for both 2D and OpenGL rendering are available on Xi Graphics' Web site - [www.xig.com](http://www.xig.com).

Xi Graphics’ commercial-off-the-shelf (“COTS”) graphics drivers and X servers have been used in systems deployed by the US Armed Services (including the Army’s FBCB2 program), NASA, US Departments of Homeland Security, Energy, and Justice, among others. The software has a well earned reputation of being high-performance, high-quality graphics software that conforms to the standards for the X Window System (used with Linux and UNIX® systems such as Solaris) and for OpenGL.

The Summit v2.2 graphics drivers for the ToughBook CF-29 were developed by Xi Graphics with the cooperation of Intel and Panasonic who provided the necessary documentation required for the development, and the hardware for testing.

Each Summit v2.2 graphics driver is available in demo mode for download from the Xi Graphics Web site for compatibility and performance testing. Users can purchase a Summit License Key on-line which, when installed, converts a demo into permanent product. A license is required for each computer on which an Accelerated-X Summit driver is used as permanent product. Prices for the Summit v2.2 Laptop License Keys for the CF-29 ToughBook are \$139 each. Quantity discounts are available.
